When healthcare services aim to help patients and relatives to cope with the changes illness causes - for a shorter or longer period - it must be based on values concerning our attitude towards the ill and the ways in which illness is perceived to impact on life.

The challenge is; if and how it can be possible in the 21st century healthcare system?

The health care system in the future creates a new communicative and relational reality with new types of communication, new health technology solutions, increasing use of social media, improved access to information and knowledge, increasing demands on involvement of patients and relatives, large complexity and short time where patients' needs must be identified as well as reorganisation of the healthcare system. Furthermore accelerated patient pathways, early discharge, high expectations from patients and conversion of inpatient services to outpatient services will lead to an increased demand for care and caring capacities.
